## Message from the Assistant Director

Greetings Fellow Hog's

I would like to wish each of you and your family the Merriest Christmas and Happiest New Year possible.

As I write my last article of the year I sit and think 2018 came and went in a flash and now 2019 is right around the corner. With a New Year comes new opportunities, memories and ways to just plain enjoy the road in front of us.

I want to highlight some changes coming with the 2019 calendar year. The first change is the elimination of the HOG point system which has been around for several years. After reviewing the responses from the survey that was sent out, the board voted and eliminated the points system. Of the responses received 84% were in favor of eliminating the current points system.

The board voted to maintain the practice of issuing a \$25 gift card once you have completed 20 rides and a \$50 gift card for 50 or more rides. What will take place each month is a list of Road Captains that have planned and completed 2 or more rides during the month. They will be entered into a drawing for a chance to win a \$50 gift card. Two Road Captains will be drawn at each meeting that has planned & completed at least 2 rides.

The board also wanted to encourage volunteering within the Chapter so a similar program was set up for volunteers. If you volunteer for a Chapter event such as the Hot Dog Stand, Biker Block Party, Present wrapping or other event, you will be entered into a drawing for a \$25 gift card and 2 names will be drawn each month.

The monthly meeting times have changed slightly. The meet and great will begin at 9:00 AM-9:30 AM and meeting from 9:30AM-10:30 AM. Dates and times are on the calendar.

The monthly board meetings will continue to be held in the small room, just off the Bar Area, at HOULIGAN'S Sports Bar & grille. We will be dining 5-6 PM and Board/Road Captains Meeting from 6-7 PM

So we may update our Newsletter and HOG Chapter INFO at the Dealership, right after the January Chapter meeting, Photo's will be taken of the newly elected & assigned position personnel by Mark "Skully" Klayman.





#### BRACING YOURSELF FOR THE FLORIDA WINTER

Yes, it's that time of year when our northern friends and family are posting Face Book photos of snow blocked roads, blocked driveways, and cars buried by passing snow plows. I assume most of us have shown them sincere empathy by posting comments about our mutual harsh winter conditions here including a few photos of ourselves wearing shorts under a palm tree at the beach. Admittedly, Florida is not noted for harsh winters, but anyone who has participated in the International Ride during Bike Week will tell you mornings here can be downright cold. I often joke that Florida has about a two week winter season. However, it's not unusual here during the winter for temperatures to start out in the mid 30's and climb to the 60's or even 70's by lunch time. During these low temperatures, certain safety issues warrant comment. HYPOTHERMIA is defined as that situation when body core temperature drops below 95 degrees. Symptoms include uncontrollable shivering, numbness, a decline in our fine motor skills, slower mental reactions and even a loss of consciousness. It doesn't require that temperatures be below freezing. WIND CHILL is defined as a quantity expressing the effective lowering of the air temperature caused by the wind, especially as affecting the rate of heat loss from a body. If you consult the Motorcycle Wind Chill Chart (included), you can see that riding 55 mph at a 50 degree temperature results in a wind chill of 25 degrees. For our International Ride these last two years, temperatures started out approximately 35 degrees which when riding at 55 mph resulted in a wind chill factor of zero degrees. If you don't take the proper steps to protect yourself, it won't take long before you'll be in trouble.

#### THE FOLLOWING ARE A FEW HELPFUL HINTS

EAT A GOOD MEAL. Your body needs fuel in order to generate heat.

**ALWAYS CHECK THE FORECAST BEFORE SETTING OUT.** Invest in a thermometer mounted on your handlebars if you don't already have one to monitor the changes as your ride proceeds.

ADJUST THE LENGTH OF YOUR RIDE. Include rest stops where you can get warm and drink some warm fluids. Of course, avoid alcohol for the obvious safety concerns along with the fact that alcohol promotes heat loss.

DRESS APPROPRIATELY. Dress in layers that will keep you warm starting out that you can later shed as temperatures rise. Avoid cotton as a base layer! Cotton poorly evaporates sweat compared to wool, silk, or synthetic fibers. Moisture is your enemy when trying to stay warm. Don't wear tight or constrictive clothing. You need air pockets between the layers to insulate you from the cold. Bring an extra layer.

**BLOCK THE WIND.** Outer layers (jackets and chaps) made from leather or wind resistant fabrics are a good choice. Your rain suit can also be effective. Don't forget to zip up your jacket vents. Adjust your fairing vents as well.

**COVER YOUR HEAD AND FACE.** Full face helmets or three quarter helmets with a face shield work best. Balaclavas and scarfs can protect the neck regions.

**DON'T FORGET YOUR FEET.** Synthetic, wool or silk socks can keep your feet warm, but remember to leave ample room for your toes to move. Consider lower fairings on your engine guards, permanent or snap on type.

**WEAR INSULATED GLOVES. Glove** hand liners of wool, silk, or synthetic fabrics can add to your warmth. Remember to leave ample space for your fingers to move.

**ELECTRIC RIDING GEAR CAN BE A GOOD OPTION.** Electric jackets, vests, pants, gloves, and shoe inserts can make you very comfortable.

EQUIP YOUR BIKE WITH HEATED HAND GRIPS AND HEATED SEAT.

**TEST YOUR OUTFIT BEFORE YOU RIDE.** This could be a simple ride around your block a few times. Make sure you are comfortable, not too cold or too warm. Make sure you can turn your head easily so that your vision is not restricted. Make sure you can still easily operate your hand and foot controls with the larger insulated gloves and/or possibly different boots.

**DON'T FORGET ABOUT THE NEEDS OF YOUR PASSENGER!** If they are uncomfortable, I promise that you will also be uncomfortable!

#### **Bike Stuff**

2018 is in the rearview mirror. We didn't get much riding in as we had several health issues. Things are looking up. I start the new year in cardiac rehab 3 days a week for 12 weeks but it's all good. We are both looking forward to adding miles to our bikes in 2019.

In addition to Parking Lot Practice I plan on hitting a parking lot to sharpen my riding skills. Last week I was going into a highspeed right hand turn a little too fast. It appeared to me that I was going to run off the road, not a good idea as there was a fence on the edge of the road. Years of teaching the basic riders class went through my mind. I remembered turn your head and press harder on the handlebars. It worked. The floor board folded up. I dragged the frame, however the rear wheel never lost contact with the pavement. The motorcycle has more ability that its rider. This technique worked for me.

Learning the proper procedure for high speed turns is a must if you plan on riding in the mountains this spring, plus it makes riding more enjoyable no matter what bike your riding. Diane was on the Tail of the Dragon several years ago on a 400cc scooter. She passed several sport bikes. She was wearing a shirt that said, "you were passed by a girl", not to mention on a scooter.

The approved technique for cornering is SLOW, LOOK, PRESS and ROLL. Slow means slow to an appropriate entry speed. Look turn your head and look in the direction you want to go. Press means press on the handlebars in the direction you want to go. Roll means roll on the throttle, this step plants your suspension and pulls you out of the corner. If you are going into a corner too fast (don't touch your brakes) press on the bars harder. Next corner you should lower your entry speed.

We always talk about and practice slow speed turn, but most of your cornering will be at speeds. Find an empty parking lot and practice by starting off slow.

For a good and safe ride, ride your own ride. If you stay within your abilities, stay within your bike's abilities and within the condition the road and traffic allow, you will always have a fun and safe ride. We are looking forward to riding and having fun in 2019. Thanks to Dan and Roger for all their efforts at PLP. Hope to see you all at the next PLP. Merry Christmas and a happy New Year to all
