SAFETY BRIEFING Read at the monthly meeting on 4/23/16

Our road captains do a good job and are well trained. I have been asked to expound on several issues that were said during the pre-ride meeting.

- There seems to be confusion on the 2 second following distance. Its real simple. When the vehicle in front of you passes a point, it could be a street sign, mail box or intersection, just count one, one thousand, one, one thousand two. At the second number you should be at the point the vehicle in front of you was when you began counting, simple.
- If you are closer than 2 seconds stay alert and be prepared to take the proper action should an incident occur. If you are 3, 4 or more seconds behind several things can occur. First you are adding to the rubber band effect. That is the group getting longer and shorter, causing riders in the back to speed up and then brake. Add to that you are inviting cars to cut into your formation. This can cause riders with out knowledge of the destination to rush, run red lights and stop signs so they won't be left behind.
- What can we as riders do about these situations. Keep the size of the group smaller than we are doing. Depending on what safety group you check with its recommended M/C group rides be kept to 6 to 10 riders. Why you ask? With a second following distance at highway speeds 8 bikes are the length of a semi and most car driver can pass a semi truck.
- We ride at the speed limit, most other vehicle go 5 to 10 over the limit. If traffic backs up behind the group the best way to avoid an incident would be for the rear road captain to radio the lead R/C and pull into a parking lot (not on the side of the road, no, no, no) and let the back up pass you safely.
- What to do if you can't keep up? We always tell riders to ride their own ride. Let the R/C

know you're uncomfortable, perhaps you could ride in the front next to the lead R/C or perhaps we could set up a second yet smaller group. The benefits of being up front—you won't get left behind and the rubber banding will be reduced. Don't day dream, keep your head and eyes up, staying alert.

We all want a safe fun ride, if you have any ideas on how to increase safety, please let myself, a board member or your favorite R/C know.

Safety Article

At Aprils board meeting I was asked to prepare a safety briefing for the general membership meeting held on April 23. A copy should be elsewhere in this news letter. It was to be based on group riding and explain several things said by our very capable road captains at the pre-ride briefing. It was met with grumbling and several argumentative emails.

I mentioned we ride at the speed limit and most car drivers drive 5 to 10 over the limit. This causes traffic to back up behind us on a 2 lane road. In an effort to prevent some car attempting to pull an unsafe pass, a suggestion would be to pull into a gas station or parking lot (not on the side of the road) and let the cars pass safely. When I finished making that statement a member said "no, no, no", I would be happy to discuss that with you. First off I do not make stuff up when it comes to motorcycle safety. This suggestion (and it is just a suggestion) came from a National Highway Traffic and Safety Administration safety video. It would be up to the road captains to make the call if that maneuver became necessary.

Another email "our road captains exceed the speed limit signs in turns". Not to be picky but the white rectangular signs with a number and MPH on it are the posted speed limit. The yellow signs are information advisory signs. When I was a young police officer working uniform patrol I remember being told they applied to trucks only. I will suggest our R/C slow while in curves.

The 2 second following distance also caused some hot emails. If you are uncomfortable with a 2 second following distance, due to the rubber band effect, a suggestion is to break into smaller groups leaving 5 minuets apart. A new rider or one with a new bike could ride up front next to or behind the lead r/c. That could also go for a rider not knowing the route being taken and concerned with getting left behind. If you are uncomfortable with riding in formation or don't like the route being taken do what Diane and I did in the past, we would meet the chapter at the rides end and yes you still get ride points.

Once again I don't make answers up off the top of my head. I go by my training as a Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider coach. In addition I research the what and whys of motorcycle safety. Please remember the object is to ride, have fun and remain safe while riding.

I started as safety officer in 1999 and have served 3 times for a total of 14 years. The first time I volunteered the second and third I was drafted. I don't want to hog (pun intended) the position therefore I'm retiring. If you're interested in the safety officer position please let the board know.

I would continue to assist Roger and Dan with PLP and help Jerry conduct the next road captains training.

Screw it lets ride.

Greetings and first, I am really missing you all but life has had its hold on me and our family. I want you each Hog member to know we continue to pray for you and keep you in our hearts.

During this time, I was talking with my sister and she began to talk to me about my mom's life motto, which I had never heard about. I actually shared this at the funeral, but I also think it might help some of us who live through stuff

Her motto was "you play the hand you have been dealt". Now my mom was not a poker player but a Bridge player. I actually had to read up on Bridge to find out how you played it. Unlike Poker in which you can "Fold-em", (many of us try to "fold" our lives situations, but they never go away until you play them out)- Bridge you have to play the cards you are dealt. This was my mom's thinking. She had been through a lot, like many of us, but I never heard my mom complain. Even this past 2 years being bed ridden, never complained. Losing My dad to cancer in his early 60's, never complained. She did not like it, but never complained. In her 40's she survived Cervical cancer, with 3 small children to care for. Like all of us she literally walked through the fire, with trust she would somehow make it through. Back to the game of Bridge, in bridge you also have a partner. You can rely upon their hand to help you out or you help them, but you do not know what they hold. The good news is in our lives we have a partner, God, who has our back. He is here to help us, heal us and give us wisdom through the process. No matter what you going through you are not alone. And if you will just play it out, live life with peace and joy through it. THIS TOO SHALL PASS!

So just to let you know, I might have been absent the past few months but you continue to be in our thought..... AND Prayers ... blessing and respect Pastor Frank




