ACCIDENT MANAGEMENT PART 2

In the last newsletter I discussed how to first protect the scene of an accident. Now it's time to attend to the victim (s). Call 911 and don't hang up until the 911 operator does so. Go to the victim and evaluate for CPR. If trained, provide

CPR only if necessary. Next, start at the head and move down the body to the toes evaluating for other injuries such as major bleeding or broken bones. Control bleeding by applying direct pressure with bandages, towels, clothing etc. Use a tourniquet as a last resort. Keep the victim still even if they want to move and offer encouragement. Just because they feel well initially, doesn't mean they won't start having a problem a few minutes later. Watch the victim for shock. Keep the individual warm or cool depending on the situation. If conscious, talk to the victim. Ask questions like "What is your name? Do you know where you are? What happened? Were you alone? Continue to ask these questions periodically to see if there is a change in the victim's mental status. Relay all this information to the 911 operator, remember, you are still in contact on the phone. As a general rule, don't move the victim unless safety is a major concern. If the victim is breathing, conscious or unconscious, DO NOT REMOVE THE HELMET! This could make a spinal injury much worse! There is one situation where there can be an exception to this rule. This is a controversial topic among first responders. When the victim has an obstructed airway causing the cessation of all breathing and is wearing a helmet that prohibits administration of CPR (such as a full face helmet with a face shield), the victim will die if rescue breathing is not administered. A trained individual will have someone stabilize the head and then pull the helmet off in line with the spine. In summary, you can do a lot just by knowing where you are and calling 911. You can help more by learning CPR and taking First Aid classes. Captains are encouraged to always carry a phone and a First Aid Kit. Safety classes offered by our chapter are open to all members and are not just for Road Captains.








A retired NYPD motor officer stopped by, at first he watched then asked the normal questions. Who are we? What are we doing and what does it cost? He was impressed with the skill of our members. At the end of our session he and Dan put on an exhibition that was worth the price of admission, free. Come on out and watch or participate.

I always mention "All the Gear All the Time", ATGATT. I can hear the groaning now "he is going to talk about helmets". No I am going to talk about a different and mostly forgotten piece of safety gear. Hearing protection or ear plugs. Did you ever return from a long distance ride and hear ringing in your ears? Well ear plugs can stop the ringing. In addition they can reduce fatigue. The biggest take away is it will protect your hearing. Several of my long time ridding friends need hearing aid's, they are going deaf. I have been using ear plugs for many years and as of today I still have good hearing. Take it for what its worth. To the nay sayers you can still here the sounds you need to hear.

If you are going to travel across the country you might want to check on state laws as they relate to hearing protection, as they vary by state. For example here in Florida you can have speakers in your helmet and ear plugs in your ear however the use of ear buds are against Florida Law. Alaska, Ohio and Virginia prohibit ear protection. California and Maryland allow ear plugs that are "designed to attenuate injurious noise levels" as long as sirens and horns can still be heard.






