I know there are several members that are very knowledgeable as well but I wanted to offer my assistance.



Road Captain's PLP was a different story. PLP was started in 1999 by the Drill Team. The R/C's PLP this month was the best.... ever and that is saying a lot. We used the Ultimate Bike Bonding Rider's Course as a guide. If you have never taken this class, you should know it is the closest thing to a motorman's course available to the public.

We started with short classroom, ideas were shared, and safety rules discussed. The range began with a basic weave as a warm up. From there we rode exercises that directly related to our road captains and their duties. We did a pause and go, that is when you make a full stop without putting your feet down. Yes, I stalled during the demo, embarrassing, yes, but hey I'm not perfect. From there we went to a sharp turn from a stop, executing both left and right turns.

We realized they were having fun when the circle weave started. I began with the largest circle allowed in the UBBRC. I was asked to make it tighter twice. Upon completion our riders were doing the exercise as tight as the MSF allows. The day ended with a lane change drill. The riders had to work together not only on lane changes but on their spacing.

By the end of the day it was apparent everyone enjoyed the class and shared a few safety tips.

Some big thanks go out to all our Road Captains. They get us to our destination safe and efficiently. I will not make the next PLP as Diane and I will be on a road trip. Until then please ride safe.




