

Message from the Director

Greetings fellow HOG's

As your Director, I wanted to share with you some changes our Board of Directors have made during the last couple of months.

First we needed to define what a 'Chapter Ride' is, as it is connected to program that impacts us financially.

A 'Chapter Ride' is defined as follows;

A rider/passenger must meet at the **starting point or pick up point** of a designated ride and sign in on the Road Captain's sign-in sheet. It is acceptable for riders to arrange with the Lead Road Captain of any ride a pick up point along the way to the final destination. The practice of contacting the lead road captain of a ride and advising them you will be meeting them at the final destination is welcome however that participation will not be considered a chapter ride.

It is understood that due to many circumstances such as mechanical issues, weather, rider health or not being comfortable riding in a group, riders may choose to use alternate transportation such as but not limited to a car/truck and that will be acceptable as long as they follow paragraph one.

The board also wanted to address the increasing number of multiple rides and its financial impact on the Chapter. The board decided that <u>all rides are to start at the Destination Complex unless approved by the Board</u> for special events. AND ... no matter how many stops on the ride it is counted as one ride only. Special events such as the current 'Let's Go Park-N Ride' will remain as an individual ride for each location whether in a group or alone, example *4 parks= 4 rides*, *5 parks = 5 rides etc.* [This is one time ONLY]

- ➤ We have also adjusted the gift card prizes we award to Road Captains and Volunteers. This will take effect May 1, 2019. All volunteers for a chapter specific event will be entered into a drawing monthly for one (1) \$25 Rossmeyer Gift Card.
- ➤ Road Captains that plan and lead at least three (3) rides during a calendar month will be entered into a drawing and two (2) winners will be chosen for a \$25 Rossmeyer Gift Card each.
- Members will still receive a \$25 gift card once for twenty (20) rides have been completed, and a second Gift Card valued at \$25, once, when you have completed fifty (50) Chapter Rides.

The board recognizes the need to promote riding while still maintaining our financial well-being.

I remain open and available to discuss chapter business with any member so please do not hesitate in contacting me or any board member. It is our duty to serve you the membership in the best way possible.

How about some information about those Charger Units

It's true most of us leave our cell phone charger plugged into the wall even when we're not using it. The good news is that while the charger does use a tiny bit of power when left plugged into the outlet, it's only about 23 cents a year for an FPL residential customer.

This small amount of energy use is called "phantom energy." Power adapters, like cell phone chargers, aren't the only items that use a little bit of energy when they're plugged in. In fact, many electronic items are in "standby" mode when turned off, helping them turn on faster or respond to a remote control. Devices with lit digital displays use power too, albeit a very small amount. You can avoid this by unplugging unused items until needed or using power strips to cut power to multiple items with one switch.

As far as cell phones are concerned, they use very little electricity even when you are actively charging them. In fact, the annual cost of charging your phone eight hours a night is just \$0.65 cents a year if the phone is off while charging, or \$1.30 per year if it's switched on. Not bad for a convenience most of us can't live without.

And · · · Speaking of electrical useage...

In case you were thinking of buying hybrid or an electric car:

Ever since the advent of electric cars, the REAL cost per mile of those things has never been discussed. All you ever heard was the mpg in terms of gasoline, with nary a mention of the cost of electricity to run it. This is the first article I've ever seen and tells the story pretty much as I expected it to. Electricity has to be one of the least efficient ways to power things yet they're being shoved down our throats. Glad somebody finally put engineering and math to paper. I was talking to a neighbor, a BC Hydro-Executive. I asked him how that renewable thing was doing. He laughed, then got serious. If you really intend to adopt electric vehicles, he pointed out, you had to face certain realities. For example, a home charging system for a Tesla requires 75 amp service. The average house is equipped with 150 amp service. On our small street (approximately 25 homes), the electrical infrastructure would be unable to carry more than three houses with a single Tesla each. For even half the homes to have electric vehicles, the system would be wildly over-loaded. This is the elephant in the room with electric vehicles. Our residential infrastructure cannot bear the load. So as our genius elected officials promote this nonsense, not only are we being urged to buy these things and replace our reliable, cheap generating systems with expensive, new windmills and solar cells, but we will also have to renovate our entire electrical delivery system! This latter "investment" will not be revealed until we're so far down this dead end road that it will be presented with an 'OOPS...!' and a shrug.

If you want to argue with a green person over cars that are eco-friendly, just read the following. Note: If you ARE a green person, read it anyway. It's enlightening. Eric test drove the Chevrolet Volt at the invitation of General Motors and he writes, "For four days in a row, the fully charged battery lasted only 25 miles before the Volt switched to the reserve gasoline engine". Eric calculated the car got 30 mpg including the 25 miles it ran on the battery. So, the range including the 9-gallon gas tank and the 16 kwh battery is approximately 270 miles. It will take you 4.5 hours to drive 270 miles at 60 mph. Then add 10 hours to charge the battery and you have a total trip time of 14.5 hours. In a typical road trip your average speed (including charging time) would be 20 mph. According to General Motors, the Volt battery holds 16 kwh of electricity. It takes a full 10 hours to charge a drained battery. The cost for the electricity to charge the Volt is never mentioned, so I looked up an average cost for electricity. (it varies with amount used and the seasons) \$1.16 per kwh. 16 kwh x \$1.16 per kwh = \$18.56 to charge the battery. \$18.56 per charge divided by 25 miles = \$0.74 per mile to operate the Volt using the battery. Compare this to a similar size car with a gasoline engine that gets only 32 mpg. \$3.19 per gallon divided by 32 mpg = \$0.10 per mile.

The average gasoline powered car costs about \$20,000 while the Chevrolet Volt costs \$46,000-plus. So the American Government does not wants loyal Americans to do the math, but simply pay three times as much for a car, that costs more than seven times as much to run, and takes three times longer to drive across the country.


Hopefully with his medical procedure the end of April all will be right in our health world again.

HONK! HONK! RIGHT ON RED!

I thought it might be of interest to clarify the 'Right on Red Law' and then explain the policy our Road Captains follow during our chapter rides. To begin with, let's define the law. According to the FLORIDA DRIVING MANUEL "Motorists must come to a complete stop at the marked stop line or before moving into the crosswalk or intersection. After stopping, you may turn right on red at most intersections if the way is clear – the exception being intersections displaying a NO TURN ON RED sign. Motorists must yield the right of way to pedestrians, oncoming vehicles and vehicles making legal U-turns." The Energy Policy and Conservation Act of 1975 required that for a state to receive federal assistance in developing mandated conservation programs, they must permit right turns on red as the statement above describes. As of 1980 all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and Guam have complied.

I, as well as many of my fellow Road Captains, despite honking horns and comments echoing behind us from "Four Wheelers" and sometimes fellow chapter members, <u>have resisted making a legal right turn on red at a traffic signal</u>. <u>Our HOG Chapter Road Captain policy</u> is **No Right On Red!** The reason is simple **It's a safety issue**.

While I often make a right turn on red while driving solo, it's a whole new ball game when a Road Captain has a string of riders behind them on a chapter ride. It was explained to me like this. During my initial Road Captain training, I was asked "What was the length of my bike?" "Eight and a half feet." was the wrong answer. The correct answer was, "The lead Road Captain's bike is measured from the front of the lead bike to the rear of the last bike in the group." That's always the mind-set that the lead Road Captain must follow. Turning right on red may initially appear safe, only to see the situation change suddenly for the worse when a vehicle pulls out of a side street, parking lot or parking space or makes a U-turn that would put them on a direct course to intersect with group members who might still be turning at the stoplight. It is the intention of a Road Captain to keep the group together and safe. In many cases it is appropriate for the Road Captain to slow a group down in order to catch a stop light and wait for a full interval to provide a better chance for all their riders to get thru an intersection or to even stop and wait for a <u>turn-lane only arrow</u>. Group riders can help this situation by tightening up the group at stoplights and being ready to move when the traffic signal changes. We're out on the roads to enjoy ourselves. What's the hurry?

HAVE FUN, RIDE SAFELY AND KEEP LIV'N THE DREAM!

There is a two-letter word in English has more meanings than any other two-letter word, and that word is 'UP.'

It is listed in the dictionary as an [adv.], [prep.], [adj.], [n], [v]. PLEASE read until the end

It's easy to understand 'UP', meaning toward the sky or at the top of the list, but when we awaken in the morning, why do we wake 'UP'?

At a meeting, why does a topic come UP? Why do we speak UP?, and why are the officers UP for election? and why is it UP to the secretary to write UP a report? RIDING INTO HISTORY

"WW II COASTAL WATCH TOWER"

While riding along A1A in Ormond Beach, many of you have probably noticed the WW II Coastal Watch Tower that guards the beach at 2177 Ocean Shore Blvd. Many tourists falsely believe it to be a "Shark Tower or Lifeguard Station". There is a plaque located below the thirty foot structure which gives a very brief history. There is a parking pull off in front of the structure as well as ample parking across the road.

Just after the attack on Pearl Harbor in 1941, thousands of Americans volunteered for The Ground Observation Corps. They built and manned approximately 15,200 of these watch towers along the Atlantic, Gulf and Pacific coasts. That averages to about one tower per every 6 miles. They were armed with civilian lookouts carrying merely binoculars and a telephone to alert the Coast Guard. They were to report on any invasion by sea or air, but far too often they only spotted survivors of our merchant fleet.

In 1942 German U-boats, as part of Operation Drumbeat, sank 233 ships in the Atlantic and Gulf, many of which were only one to two hours from port. Explosions lit up the horizon at night. Germany believed that the Soviet Union was on the verge of collapse and if they could prevent the US from supplying Great Britain, they could invade the British Isles and then return to defeat the Russians later. They felt that it would take the Americans at least 18 months before becoming a serious factor. The US Navy deceived the public about these attacks and the news media agreed to government censorship so as to hide how unprepared our military was at the time and to avoid public hysteria. In the first 7 months of 1942 the US lost 22% of the tanker fleet. Finally the industrial might of America took over, and they built 65 antisubmarine vessels and required all shipping to be escorted by convoys. There were mandatory shore blackouts so as not to silhouette our coastal shipping to the U-boats. The Hooligan Navy, consisting mostly of fishing boats and yachts, patrolled our coasts. The Civil Air Patrol, of which 20 % were woman, patrolled off our coasts to report U-boat sightings. Later developments of radar and sonar sealed the Germans fate.

The structure that stands today was made an historic site in the mid 1990's and was refurbished in 2005. It has withstood a world war and numerous hurricanes. I hope you enjoyed the RIDE!


