

Surviving Bike Week 101

All,

Well, we (Susan and I) just worked Bike Week 2019 and we have survived to tell. It was my third and her second event. The first one I was the parking lot/service entrance monitor and the last two I have been inside in service-moving bikes, cleaning bikes, shuffling inventory etc. Susan was the cashier inside service, kind of a Jill-of-all trades-releasing bikes that had paid to customers, cashiering, doing daily reports, answering the phones and so on. She took the brunt of this week in our house-working 12-13 hours per day/ 9 days straight. I limited myself to hours of 10 to 10.5 hrs. per day. 

THE SKY IS FALLING

Safety Officer

Since I became the Safety Officer in the autumn of 2016, I have attempted to provide an original article each newsletter without duplicating. Although fun, I must admit sometimes it can be challenging to come up with new ideas for articles. Sometimes, however, I find ideas literally blocking the road in front of me. As I have often mentioned, I live on a section of the Ormond Beach Scenic Loop and Trail. The scene above, shown in the photographs, I've confronted more than once since I've moved hear five years ago. The section of the Loop including Walter Boardman Lane and High Bridge Road is my favorite area and I have the good fortune to pass thru this region multiple times each day. The Motorcycle Safety Foundation, MSF, encourages all riders to use the SEE strategy at all times when riding. SEE is an acronym for **SEARCH**, **EVALUATE** and **EXECUTE**. In other words, we need to look as far ahead as possible looking for potential hazards and have a strategy to avoid these hazards before we need to execute our escape plan. The photos above, taken at Cobb's Corner on High Bridge Road, demonstrate what happens when people don't participate in the SEE strategy. In the photo, the box truck driver chose a path which did not allow for enough vertical and side clearance to get past the roadside tree with overhanging branches. Someone approaching the box truck, if not paying attention, would suddenly see tree branches dropping on the road before them blocking their path. If they had not evaluated the possibility that the truck might be too tall to clear the tree, they may not have time to stop. Non local drivers are often routed by their GPS devices thru this section of the Loop. Box trucks, RVs and tractor trailers are notorious for hitting overhanging branches and sideswiping trees at the edge of the road. What you don't see in the photo is the car behind the box truck which had the remaining section of the approximately 9 inch diameter tree branch laying on and partly crushing the car's roof. Apparently the car did not identify the potential hazard in advance and did not have a plan or time to execute that plan. The car can be repaired, but can you imagine that size limb landing on a motorcycle rider. The primary cause of most accidents is following a vehicle too close when the vehicle ahead does the unexpected. The next time you're traveling westbound on High Bridge Road upon exiting Cobb's Corner look up and to your right and see the scraped bark on the trees and the piece of metal trim imbedded in one of the trees at the edge of the road. This piece of trim has been there long before the above incident.

Feeling hungry? In Oregon you can now legally salvage your own roadkill.

Of all the myriad ways your local municipality schemes to separate us from our hard-earned cash, none feels as devious as the lowly traffic ticket. A moving violation is like a gut punch to your self-esteem, an ambush to your autonomy, the long arm of Johnny Law reminding you that nobody's above the syncopated flash of red and blue in the rear view.

But a California stop might be the least of your worries in some states. Either way, roadkill is now on the menu. Yum.
- **2. Hawaii just signed an unusual new shoulder lane law, but it's not all that clear.** Motorcycles can now use shoulder lanes, <u>but only when the Department of Transportation says so</u>—so quite a few details need to be ironed out, even though the law took effect in January 2019.

According to statute 7411.0565, students must always wear pants when riding. It also mentions suiting up in protective clothing, gloves, helmets, and eye wear too, so, sorry, super-casual riders. ATGATT, you know.
- **6.** If you're a wheelie demon, the state of Maine wants to have a stern talk with you—and maybe slap on some wrist jewelry. While laws against wheelies are pretty common, Maine's regulation says a person "may not intentionally or knowingly raise the front wheel of a motorcycle off the surface." But what if you simply Could. Not. Stop. your Triumph Speed Triple RS's front end from elevating? Accidents happen, right?
- **7. Don't let the 'Sooner State' Police see that** *Avengers* **mag.** It's a crime to read comic books behind the wheel when driving in **Oklahoma**. We guess it's okay if you're scanning through a *War and Peace* hardcover, or emailing your beau on an iPad, but illustrations seem to drive the local po-po nuts.

- **8.** There's some debate about this, but in Alabama it's apparently legal to drive the wrong way down a one-way street if you have a lantern attached to the front of your car. In that case, we can think of a couple of dudes on Electra Glide Ultra Classics who easily qualify. Did we also mention that it's illegal to drive with a blindfold on in Alabama? What's up with that, 'Bama?
- **9.** Welcome to Nevada—now get your camel off the highway. Yep, it's illegal In Nevada to drive a camel on the slab, though doing laps around the block seems fine. The Africa Twin's probably a better fit for the desert anyway.


