

Message from the Director

Greetings Fellow HOG's,

I recently read an article, published back in 2016, in Moto-Garage that highlighted several reasons why we ride motorcycles and I thought it was fitting for our Chapter;

1. Passion

Anything that gets your blood racing is probably worth doing. For many bikers riding a motorcycle is not a hobby or need, it's Passion. All they want in life is to travel to every corner of the world on their motorcycle. There is a deep fire in their belly for riding which will make them achieve impossible miles, paths & terrains. Bikers will not mind devoting a good amount of time and income for their motorcycles. In the hierarchy of needs, for them it's motorcycling that stays on the top.

2. Freedom

Riding a motorcycle gives you a sense of freedom. You are in total control of the moment, you are not just riding, you are flying and there are no set limits to stop you. You can travel to any place with complete freedom. It lets you be you without anyone's permission. Just like a kid who was always restricted to his space but as soon as he gets on his bicycle, it's the moment of freedom, he now breaks those chains and flies through the street on his bicycle with the widest smile on his face.

It might sound like a cliche but it's true, when on your bike you experience the open air with the wind brushing through your face, all the colors around is vivid and vibrant. The sound of the motor, the vibration which you feel. the obscured view going on around you. It's an embracement of senses and acts as oxygen to your soul. We just love it, the sheer enjoyment of being on a motorcycle.

3. Speed

For most of the riders its speed and thrill that keeps them on their motorcycles. Motorcycles are legal drugs that make you high and take you into a transcendent state of nirvana. The high of power and the acceleration they get at the flick of their wrist is something that they look for and can't keep themselves away from. The thrill of clocking high speeds on their odometer after hitting the rev limiter beyond its limit on each shift is something they are addicted to, which gives the best adrenalin rush a motorcyclist can ever ask for. It's a good addiction and a good high provided they ride on safe paths or tracks with all the protective gears on.

4. Friendship

Motorcycling is one thing that keeps friends together and it will till the end of times. Everybody taking out time from their schedule and then going out for a ride is something that you will see only in the motorcycling community. The bond of friendship grows deeper when it is associated to a motorcycle. Be it a breakfast ride, a night ride or a long road trip, they are always up for it.

5. Brotherhood

You will meet some of the nicest people on your rides. When you ride a motorcycle you always wave to each other even when you don't know each other which is not something car drivers do. No matter which motorcycle you are riding nor does it matter from which part of the country you belong, there is always the bond of brotherhood that gets motorcyclist together. They are always there to help each other at any point of time. It makes you less introvert as it is the best way to socialize and know new people during two-wheeled events, including bike shows, rallies and other rider get togethers.

6. Stress Buster

Have you ever seen a motorcycle parked outside a psychiatrist's clinic? We are pretty sure the answer you will have is No, because riding a motorcycle takes away all the tension and stress, like you have rebooted your system. Riding a motorcycle brings a sense of calm and ease to your mind and body, which could be achieved otherwise only through meditation. 

TRIKES TO THE RIGHT



During the recent 2019 International Female Ride, I had the privilege to assist as a Sweep Road Captain. In the particular group that I followed there was a local female rider group that had a large number of trikes. As I walked along the line of bikes during a pre-ride inspection checking for bald tires, loose mufflers, etc., I reminded the riders that all trikes must ride on the right side of the lane. This initially was not received well and was immediately questioned. I was informed that they ride together all the time and are used to riding trikes in a staggered formation. I explained that no matter how they have ridden in the past, that was the policy that was to be followed on this ride today. Not wanting to leave it there and walk away, I stayed to explain the reasons behind this decision.

I explained that this was all about the safety of everyone participating in the ride. Each lane of traffic can be subdivided into three smaller lanes. The far left most third of the lane is #1, the middle third of the lane is #2, and the far right third of the lane is #3. Twowheelers ride in lanes #1 and #3. They are positioned two seconds behind the bike in front of them and one second to any bike to their left or right. This positioning is known as **Staggered Formation**. This allows each rider in lane #1 to maneuver around obstacles by having not only their lane #1, but also the middle lane #2. Similarly, riders in lane #3 have their lane as well as the middle lane #2 for avoidance moves. Here is where the difference between 2-wheel bikes and 3wheel trikes becomes very important. A trike's footprint occupies 2 lanes. If trikes ride in a staggered formation, each will occupy their own lane as well as sharing the middle lane #2 with each other. They will not have the room to maneuver around something ahead of them without impinging on their neighboring trike's interval and space. According to the Motorcycle Safety Foundation, trikes should never ride in staggered formation for reasons stated above. Trikes, like 2-wheelers, position themselves two seconds behind the rider in front of them and one second behind the rider to their sides. If trikes follow other trikes, there must be a two second interval. This will make the length of a group much longer if 2wheelers don't position themselves in lane #1 staggered with the trikes. One of the duties of a Road Captain is to assist in the placement of riders in the group. Shorter length groups are easier to keep together along a route. It's all about safety and fun.

Bike Stuff

In the past several years motorcycle fatalities in the State of Florida have been on the rise. There was a minor drop last year but almost not enough to mention. Volusia County has always been in the top 5 on this list. Not a good list to be on top of.

For this reason, the Florida Rider Training Program, FRTP, applied and received a grant from the state. During the month of May, two of the experienced riders classes were given free of charge. Yes, the state paid the registered motorcycle schools to conduct the class. Not all schools qualified. They had to have an approved range and coaches qualified to teach the class. All you had to do was preregister and show your driver's license with the M/C endorsement and a copy of your insurance card. There were also both a pre and post survey to fill out, the state wanted to learn what the riders thought about the course.

I am happy to report that 4 of our members took advantage of this offer. It is sad to say out of over 160 members only 4 took advantage. I myself rode one and coached 2. There was some confusion as to the class names. The first class offered was called the Basic Riders Course (BRC2) This is the updated version of the old Advanced Rider's Class (ARC) The other is a relatively new class named the Ultimate Bike Bonding Course (UBBRC) Both courses took around 6 hours.

In an effort to beat the heat we started the classes at 8:00 am so we were off the range by 2 with an hour of paperwork. The good news was that there was a good breeze on the range.

If you attend Parking Lot Practice, PLP, regularly, you could have completed either class. The UBBRC was the hardest but offered larger space for the maneuvers, if needed. There was plenty of encouragement and instruction from the staff.

I hope to see everyone at PLP until then please stay hydrated and ride safe.





Interior of the new Port Authority Terminal "OCULUS" in N·Y·C·









