THE DAYLIGHT TIME IS GETTING SHORTER

Dressed in black leather and a graphite-colored helmet, you look and feel like a badass predator. Piercing urban congestion, zapping past Priuses and dodging buses is all in a morning's work for the Boulevard Bullet. Surprisingly, despite you and your bike's combined skill sets, you're actually not the predator—you're the prey. That's because in any altercation with a car, you're dead meat—and the driver walks away, sorry that he "just didn't see you." You were dressed in stealth black, after all. In nature, vulnerable critters blend into their surroundings to avoid detection by predators, thus aiding survival. While this works fine for skinks and shrews, such invisibility actually makes riders more vulnerable to the drivers who might unwittingly take us out. They are an odd genome: hapless predators. So in a flip-flop from nature's order, rather than hide, smart riders find ways to grab drivers' attention, which means appealing to one of their five senses. Since drivers can't touch or taste or smell you, that leaves attracting their gaze or hearing. Herewith are some well-proven strategies . . .

HYPER HORNS, LOUD PIPES, REFLECTIVE RIDING GEAR, H.I.D. LIGHTING and/or a HEADLIGHT MODULATOR Think about it .. "don't you want to .. BE SEEN!?"



REMEMBER THE TWO STROKE ENGINE?

At last Bike Week I had two of my childhood friends form NY join me for a few days. We took a trip down memory lane recalling how we had all started in motorcycling at about the same time on minibikes. As we entered our teens, we graduated to real motorcycles - I went with a Kawasaki Trail Boss 100, Paul S. had a Yamaha 125 and Glen had a Suzuki 90. We had a great time with these soon gravitating to bigger and faster trail bikes and all were two strokes. We did not mind the fact that they smoked excessively - they all had auto mix capabilities, were easy to maintain and developed far more horsepower than their four stroke counter parts. Plus they weighed less as well- making them easier to handle through the woods.

But eventually with the late 60's and into the subsequent decades, pollution became more of an issue, as did noise, use of gas and oil and prices and so on and this lead to two strokes first becoming unpopular with the street crowd and eventually spilled over to the track/racing buyers. The death of the two stroke happened. Plus the corporate giants in the motorcycling industry liked four stroke power plants-more moving parts hence more maintenance, repair and high performance bucks to be made.

I still miss my two strokes-in fact in some places in the world (IE-China/India) they are still made and sold. In fact Honda and others have new development going on in this area- My friends and I cannot wait!

Message from the Head Road Captain

During a recent Road Captain Meeting it was mentioned that all the Road Captains sitting in a room discussing safety issues we have seen recently is like preaching to the choir and is not very instructive for the rest of the membership. Hopefully, without sounding like I'm Preaching; here are a few of the things we have seen recently that adds to the inherent risk of riding a Motorcycle or Trike. First riding any 2, 3 or 4 wheeled vehicle in the State of Florida is risky with people on the cell phones, some texting, I recently saw a guy holding his phone to his ear with one hand and holding a book against the steering wheel with the other; then there are the older drivers with bad eye site and slower reaction times. Needless to say, it's risky driving anything here in Florida but 2 or 3 wheel adds to the risk. Then when we place a bunch of 2&3 wheeled vehicles to a group the risk increases again.

The riskiest things we do when riding as a group are Lane Changes, Left Turns and Right Turns. In short, anything but going straight down the road adds risk. When it comes to changing lanes, please do not move into the new lane before the lead Road Captain. Just because we have a turn signals on, doesn't mean it is safe for the entire group to move. The Turn Signal is how the Rear RC is notified that the Lead RC wants to move the group into the other lane. If someone in the middle jumps into the lane before the Lead RC, they are now blocking the view of the Lead RC and have at times blocked a car or two into the middle of the group. Please Stay in the lane until the Lead RC moves into the other lane.

Now for turns; this includes left, right, U-turns, lane changes and any other maneuver you may make on a bike 2 or 3 wheels, it doesn't matter. Just because the person in front of you makes the maneuver it doesn't mean it is safe for you to make the same maneuver, YOU MUST MAKE YOUR OWN HEAD CHECK. I have seen on numerous occasions members just following the person in front of them. They didn't notice the car in the other lane. They didn't notice the light had turn red and now cars are entering the intersection, and they didn't notice the car stopped at the all-way stop sign didn't know the *unwritten courtesy* of letting a group of riders all get through the stop sign together. And when it come to the *Unwritten Courtesy's* You may be right that the other drivers should have let the group go ... BUT! they have the right of way and are under *NO OBLIGATION* to let the group go. Let's be safe out there. Please ask a Road Captain or see me if you have any questions or concerns.






RIDE 365 PROGRAM

it's an afternoon get away or a transcontinental journey of a lifetime, every ride you take brings us closer together. Keep track of your lifetime mileage, because the miles count. If you aren't enrolled in the Lifetime mileage program, see your dealer to enroll.

What is Ride 365? Ride 365 is The Official Mileage Recognition Program for The Official Riding Club of Harley-Davidson. Ride 365 includes the existing Lifetime Recognition and two new programs—Annual Recognition and an annual Chapter Challenge.

Why are we doing it? To encourage you to focus on the reason you own H-D motorcycles—to ride them!

What's in it for me as a H.O.G. member? • Celebrate good times—log your miles and be recognized • Track your riding experience—rack up miles and celebrate the milestones • Contribute to your Chapter's Challenge mileage goal—have fun as you strengthen your Chapter

How will mileage be tracked? You must have your odometer mileage validated at your H-D dealership at the beginning of the calendar year. After that, you can return to the dealer throughout the year to add to your total annual mileage. **Can I enter mileage myself?** To maintain the integrity of the program, mileage must be read and entered at authorized Harley-Davidson Dealership.

Who is eligible to participate in Ride 365? Any H.O.G. member can and should participate!

If I trade in a motorcycle, can I keep the miles? Yes. The miles ridden by you, belong to you.

What if I have more than one bike? Can I register all of them in Ride 365? Yes.

Can H.O.G. members start the program at any time during the year? YES. You may check-in your mileage at any time during the year. The annual program recognizes miles ridden from January 1 through December 31, so it's smart to check-in mileage at the beginning of the year.

How many times each year do H.O.G. members have to check-in their mileage? You need only to have your odometer checked in two times each year at the dealership—the first time to validate miles on or after January 1, and the second time is for a final annual total on or before December 31. However, you'll want to check in with your dealership frequently to enter your updated miles so you can earn digital badges and add to your annual and chapter totals throughout the year. Adding your mileage will instantly update the HOG.com website and your chapter totals.



AMVETS made it official Friday, 20 SEP 19: A "Rolling Thunder"-style motorcycle rally will take place next Memorial Day weekend in Washington, D.C., to honor the nation's veterans, POWs and missing-in-action.

In a release and at a news conference, leaders of the veterans service organization American Veterans, better known as **AMVETS**, said they would continue the tradition of the annual three-day rally of thousands of motorcyclists in the nation's capital for the 2020 Memorial Day.

Last year, Artie Muller, long-time leader of the Rolling Thunder rallies that rumbled through Washington for 32 years, cited escalating costs, stating that the 2019 rally would be the last, although local chapters around the country might sponsor their own events.

Via Twitter, President Donald Trump said he hoped the Rolling Thunder riders would somehow be back again for Memorial Day in 2020 and "hopefully for many years to come."

Joe Chennelly, the national executive director of **AMVETS**, said last year that the organization was looking into the possibility of continuing the Rolling Thunder tradition. Last month **AMVETS** announced it had secured a permit from the National Park Service for a rally from **May 22-24, 2020**.

The 2020 events will be held to "to make the nation, especially our voters, aware of what is happening, what isn't happening and what needs to happen to address our POWs, our MIAs, and our veterans and active-duty service members who are dying by suicide," Chenelly said in a statement.

The new event won't use the Rolling Thunder name, Instead, the rally will be called

"Rolling To Remember."






















RIDING INTO HISTORY: "A GOOD DOG"

As I've mentioned previously, I enjoy learning and sharing the history I find myself surrounded by while riding. Many of you may already know that Linda and I have three Labrador Retrievers as cherished members of our immediate family. Although the following does relate to the early history of 20th century Daytona, it's also a human interest story. Found in the Daytona News Journal, I think this is a story that all dog lovers will enjoy.

In the year 1940 a stray dog began visiting the Daytona Cab Company on Beach Street. At the time he was estimated to be one year old. He was called "Brownie" and soon endeared himself to the cab drivers there and before long they had built him a dog house on the sidewalk in front of the business. A coffee can for donations was placed by his dog house to cover food bills, veterinary care, licenses etc. The cabbies opened a bank account at the Daytona Bank and Trust and made daily deposits. To shop owners, Brownie was not only a great dog, but also a celebrity. He was a must see for shoppers and tourists and was often seen posing with them for photographs. It was said he was well supplied with steaks and ice cream. Each year he was issued dog tag #1 by the city. He had become the "Town Dog". He was not only well known locally, but had also appeared in national publications. It was said he received Christmas cards and presents from all over the country. He was especially loved by children and was often seen playing with them in the park across the street. Brownie lived to fifteen years of age and died in 1954. His obituary and funeral arrangements made the front page of the Daytona Beach News Journal.

A law had to be changed in order to bury him in the Downtown Park across the street from his dog house. Brownie's bank account was large enough to cover his medical bills along with his funeral expenses and grave stone. Local shop owners were his pall bearers and the mayor gave his eulogy. His tombstone reads "Brownie The Town Dog 1939-1954 A Good Dog". On April 21st, 2018 a Bronze Statue of Brownie was placed in Downtown Park adjacent to Brownie's grave. I recently visited the site in the corner of the park near the Veteran's Bridge at the intersection of East Orange Avenue and South Beach Street. While there, I couldn't help but think how the love shown by and for "A Good brought Dog" had SO many people together. For further information connect to browniethetowndog.org.

RIDING DOUBLE

When I leave the mainland to cross the bridge to Flagler Beach, I am always reminded of how much I like to ride. The view of the wetlands, the vastness of the ocean, the dip in temperature and the smell of the sea breeze always gives me a special feeling. Add in a sunrise and that's almost as good as it can get. What makes it better for me is to have my wife behind me to share the experience. For those of you who already ride with a passenger or plan to in the future, I hope the following will be useful.

By Florida law, all passengers are required to have a separate seat or a seat big enough for two people and separate footrests unless riding in a side car or an enclosed cab. All passengers must have eye protection. If the passenger is under 21 years of age, they must wear an approved safety helmet. If the passenger is over 21 years of age, they are not legally required to wear a helmet, but are required to have at least \$10,000 in medical benefits for injuries that result from a motorcycle crash.

Check your owner's manual for possible adjustments in suspension and tire pressure that should be made while carrying a passenger. Make sure that you do not exceed your weight limit especially if carrying travel bags.

Make sure that you are a competent rider with the proper safety attitude before taking on the responsibility of a passenger. Instruct your passenger on the proper safety attire, All the Equipment, All the Time (ATEATT). Brief your passenger concerning balance, avoiding sudden movements, how to take a curve and being prepared for stops. Instruct them to keep their feet on the footrests at all times and away from the exhaust pipes. In short, teach your passenger how to be a "Second Active Rider" on your bike. Practice cornering and stops at lower speeds in an open safe area (like PLP) until you both feel comfortable. Have your passenger board after your kickstand is raised, your front brake is engaged, and your bike is braced. Always disembark your passenger first. Avoid backing into a parking place with your passenger aboard.

Be aware that you will need more throttle and clutch finesse when starting from a stop. Learn to brake sooner and possibly applying more pressure when stopping. More weight on the back tire may increase rear braking especially in sudden stops. More time and space will be needed for passing. Take extra care when cornering and be aware that clearances will be lower. Note that the wind, especially from the side, will be more of a factor. At night, your headlight alignment may be slightly raised when the extra weight of a passenger is added to the rear of your bike.

When you are ready, go out there and share the motorcycle experience.....
