























# Message from the Head Road Captain

Let's hope we can see a few more rides on the calendar soon. Speaking of the Heat please remember to hydrate and bring water with your, if possible. Drinking a couple of glasses of water in the morning before the ride will ensure you're hydrated, as it takes almost an hour for water to get into your system.

For anyone working on the Annual Museum Tour Challenge please note that quite a few of the Museums are closed, some permanently, That ok, just take a picture of the area with you and your bike and you will get credit for the location. Also, one of the Airport Museum has been moved inside the airport terminal at the Melbourne Airport. just take a picture of the airport sign, the correct address for the Air Force Space and Missile Museum is 100 Space Port Way, Port Canaveral, Cape Canaveral FL 32920. The name has been changed to the Sands Space History Center.

At a recent HOG Regional Officer's Conference, the topic of Trikes to Right was brought up for discussion again. This time our HOG representative weighed into the discussion and stated it is "HOG's Policy" not to tell anyone where they must ride in the group. So, going forward Road Captains will not require you to ride on the right. But we do prefer you all be on the same side of the group and prefer that side be the Right Side. This allows better visibility for the Lead RC to See his Tail RC. In any case we ride in a staggered formation and if you are following a trike whether on the right or left side of the formation, it is suggested by the Motorcycle Safety Foundation that you ride 2 seconds behind the trike, as you a are both using the center/Number 2 position at all times. Ok, we have ridden this Iron Horse enough, it didn't win the Derby, Preakness or Belmont, so let's put it out to pasture with the final thought. Lead Road Captains like to be able to quickly see that the back of the group has been able to make the turn and get through the light. *Please HELP US OUT*.

# Message from the Safety Officer

Mike "Doc" O'Toole

As the new Safety Officer for the Daytona HOG Chapter, I thought it appropriate to introduce myself....a bit. My wife and I live in Ormond Beach and I work at Embry-Riddle as a Professor of Aerospace and Occupational Safety. I am not a rocket scientist! I have over 40 years of safety and health experience in the mining, manufacturing, paper and construction industries. I hope to share practical information with the membership so we all can continue to enjoy the freedom of the road. If there is a safety related topic you want to hear about, drop me a line or catch me at a meeting.

For my first article, I want to address what I think is a safety critical and often neglected issue of your motorcycle's tires. Never underestimate the importance of having good, properly inflated tires on your motorcycle. The small contact patches provided by the front and rear tires are the motorcycle's only source of traction. Deterioration of your tires' condition can jeopardize this contact patch and bring a good ride to a quick end. Safe riding depends on selecting the right tires, inspecting and maintaining them, and replacing them as necessary.

#### SAFETY OFFICER (contd.)

It's all about *inflation*, *inflation*, *inflation*. Proper air pressure is critical for tire performance and tire life. Under-inflation or overloading can cause sluggish handling, heavy steering, and internal damage due to overflexing, and can cause the tire to separate from the rim. Over- inflation can reduce the contact area (and therefore available traction), and can make the motorcycle react harshly to bumps.

Check the air pressure when the tires are cold (at least three hours since the last ride), as part of your pre-ride "T-CLOCS" inspection (T-CLOCS means Tires and wheels, Controls, Lights, Oil, and Stands), and adjust according to your motorcycle's owner's manual or the tire information label on the chain guard, frame or swingarm. There may be two sets of recommendations for tire pressure (as well as suspension settings): one for solo riding and one for riding with a passenger and/or cargo. Do not exceed the maximum inflation pressure listed on the tire's sidewall. And never exceed the motorcycle's or tire's load limit (combined weight of operator, passenger, cargo, and accessories), since that can result in tire failure.

Ask yourself, when is the last time I checked my tire pressure?? Some of us can easily forget to check tire pressure because it never seems to vary!! Regardless of your riding experience, air pressure checks at least once a week and before long trips, including a visual inspection tires before each ride will help to avoid potentially serious consequences.

Regular inspection of the tire tread depth to ensure that adequate tread remains is also essential for safe riding. Tires have small wear bars molded into the tread grooves; when the tread is worn down to the level of the wear bars (indicating 1/32 inches of tread remaining), the wear bars become exposed and the tire should be replaced. Some manufacturers recommend replacing the tire when there are 2/32 or 3/32 inches of tread remaining.

Although it may look like there is a sufficient amount, it may not be enough to maintain traction in wet conditions. The deep grooves in fresh tires help channel water away from the contact patch, and worn tires are thinner and easier to puncture. For a quick check, if you insert a penny into a groove in the center of your tire, 2/32 of an inch is right at the top of Lincoln's head.



#### SAFETY OFFICER (contd.)

In addition to tread depth, glance over the tires' surface for any evidence of uneven wear, cuts, embedded objects, bulges, or sidewall cracking.

Every time you ride, the tires go through a "heat cycle" as they go from ambient to operating temperature and back down again. Each successive heat cycle slowly hardens the tire. Similarly, as tires age, chemical reactions cause the rubber to harden, even during nonuse. Whether through heat cycles or aging, the tire's surface becomes less spongy and less able to interlock with the protrusions and pores in the road surface. (If you have an old tire and a new tire, you can press your fingernail into the surfaces of each to see the difference in how they react.)

Tires can also absorb petroleum-based fluids from the road, which can further deteriorate the rubber. So, tires eventually have to be replaced, even if they have plenty of tread left. And don't take a chance on buying used tires; you don't know how many heat cycles they've gone through. This also means that when you buy a used motorcycle, you should thoroughly inspect the tires, and replace them if their condition is questionable.

If you'll be storing your motorcycle for more than a month, and it has a center stand, set the bike on its center stand to raise the rear tire off the ground and use blocks under the frame to lift the front tire slightly off the ground. If it doesn't have a center stand, periodically roll the bike forward or backward a few inches so the tires don't develop flat spots in the tread.

Whether you have two or three tires, you depend on them to get you down the road. Take care of them and they'll return the favor! Ride safe!

## **Harley-Davidson Research and Development**



Variable Valve Timing Patents Could Bring the Harley-Davidson V-Twin In to This Century

Provided by The Drive COVID-19 has been unkind to even the healthiest of businesses, but to already-troubled companies like the storied Harley-Davidson, the pandemic came as an unwelcome wildcard. Before production halted in March, plans for a portfolio overhaul became apparent, and as part of this agenda, Harley might introduce a new generation of V-twin engines if newly uncovered patent filings indicate anything. With its dated lineup and aging primary customer base, Harley must adapt or face the gallows, and to its credit, it isn't exactly twiddling its thumbs.

Documents dug up and published by *Motorcycle* show that <u>Harley-Davidson has officially filed for a patent for a modular engine balancer, designed to fit either end of a V-twin's crankshaft. The drawings' & accompanying descriptions mention the inclusion of a variable valve timing (VVT) phase timing module, which would be an unnecessary accommodation if no such system were in consideration. While VVT is typically used to increase power across an engine's rev range, Harley could instead use the system to reduce emissions, which have long been a thorn in the side of the beloved-yet-beleaguered bike manufacturer.</u>

This will be an on-going article[s] insert as news come out from the Harley-Davidson Motor Corporation regarding new engineering and design ideas that may influence all who own and ride a H-D motorcycle.





I have some ideas going forward to modernize, automate, and streamline the membership process. Still requires the Boards blessing. Stay tuned for further developments.





# The 'RIDE 365' Program

### **RIDE 365**

New in 2020, qualifying H.O.G. members now earn one point on their <u>Harley-Davidson VISA card</u> for every mile you ride on your H-D Motorcycle, up to 50,000 miles in a calendar year. That is up to \$500 in H-D Gift Cards from the Motor Company!

## HARLEY-OWNERS GROUP RIDE 365

#### How will my mileage be tracked?

You must have your odometer mileage validated at your H-D Dealership at the beginning of the calendar year. After that, you can return to the dealership throughout the year to add to your total annual mileage.

#### Can I enter mileage myself?

To maintain the integrity of the program, mileage must be read and entered at an authorized Harley-Davidson Dealership.

#### Can H.O.G.® members start the program at any time during the year?

**Yes.** You may check-in your mileage at any time during the year. The annual program recognizes miles ridden from January 1 through December 31, so it's smart to check-in mileage at the beginning of the year.

How many times each year do H.O.G.® members have to check-in their mileage?

You need only to have your odometer checked in two times each year at the dealership – the first time to validate miles on or after January 1, and the second time is for a final annual total on or before December 31.






