Current news from the world of Harley-Davidson

Shares of iconic motorcycle brand **Harley-Davidson** (NYSE: HOG) jumped Monday morning after the company reported its first-quarter 2021 results. As of 10:25 a.m. EDT, Harley shares were **11.4% higher than Friday's closing price.**

50 ... Why is it happening?

Harley announced **it earned \$1.68 per share in the first quarter**, significantly outpacing analyst estimates of \$0.90 per share, according to 'MarketWatch'. Revenue of \$1.42 billion matched estimates, and marked a 10% jump over sales in the prior-year period. While global retail motorcycle sales grew 9% versus the year-ago period, bike sales in North America jumped 30%.

Lower sales elsewhere were attributed to continued COVID-19 restrictions, as well as an intentional reduction in dealers and other actions related to an ongoing restructuring strategy. The company also separately announced it will "*vigorously defend*" its stance related to European Union (EU) tariffs, which are set to impose a **56% import tariff** for all Harley products within the EU, beginning in June 2021.

Now what?

Investors are shrugging off <u>the potential impacts if the EU tariff stands</u>, and focusing instead on the strong financial results. Last year, Harley announced a restructuring plan, dubbed "Rewire," intended to streamline the business. It included \$42 million in restructuring costs and 700 total layoffs. The company then introduced a (5) five-year plan, "*Hardwire*," to enhance sales and the competitive advantage of the iconic brand.

Jochen Zeitz, Harley chairman, president and CEO, said in a statement, "Harley-Davidson in 2021 is a significantly leaner, faster, and more efficient organization which is ready to win and successfully deliver on our 5-year Hardwire strategy."

With the earnings report, the company increased its guidance for the year, saying it now expects motorcycle segment revenue growth of 30% to 35% in 2021, up from a previous estimate of 20% to 25%.

Message from the Chapter Safety Officer

Thoughts of Spring

The calendar officially welcomed Spring back in March, and as such, time to get the ride out and ready for riding season. Oops, that would be so true if we lived north of the Mason-Dixon line, but here in Florida, we pretty much have riding season all year round.

Regardless of whether you ride 12 months or 7 months, this is a good time to check over some of the key items on your ride that not only ensures you are able to ride but also covers some safety concerns. The following points should be checked or reviewed more than once a year, but there are some that need to be checked more often.

- **Tires** Pressure should be checked at least monthly. Tread condition and depth every 5000 miles.
- Oil level Like tire pressure, this is an easy one to overlook. After all, with synthetic oil we can
 typically ride for about 5000 miles before an oil change. Oil levels should be checked at least
 monthly, depending on your riding distances. If you've not ridden for a while, check your oil level
 and the color of the oil. If it appears at all milky, there is moisture in the oil and the oil should be
 changed.
- **Electrical** Check for codes. If you are not sure how to do this check on you bike, stop by the dealership service department, those folks are always helpful. Make sure turn signals are functioning, both front and rear, and that your high beam headlight works.
- Fuel If you have not been riding regularly during the winter months, you may need to add a tad of
 fuel booster. If you plan on storing your bike for more than a month, add some stabilizer and top off
 your tank before storing.
- **Battery** In order to assure good battery life, using a battery tender is a solid investment. Regardless of the season, having a trickle charge will extend the life of the battery and eliminate a breakdown due to a dead battery.
- Cables Examine the visible casings and connection points for wear or excessive slack.
- Drive Belt/Chain Examine for cracks and excessive tension.
- **Nuts and Bolts** As you detail (assuming you have pride in your ride) your bike, you tend to be touching most all visible surfaces, including nuts and connectors If you find something loose, tighten using a torque wrench to Harley's specs (found in your service manual).

For most of us, these are all routine checks since we have been blessed with the opportunity to pretty much ride year-round. Not only will the above tips tend to keep you bike operating well but will also reduce the risk of a maintenance related safety mishap. Ride Safe!





A Message from your Regional Manager

It may seem hard to imagine, but rally season is here and I am hitting the road this month for the Texas Hill Country and Riding the Ozarks H.O.G. Touring Rallies!

We have completed the Regional Officer Connection (R.O.C.) online sessions for 2021. We appreciate your support and making the online format very successful. Our goal as always is to help you make your chapter the best it can be. The sessions went very well and the feedback to all three Regional Managers was very positive about the material covered and the learnings you all took away from it. Without your contributions and sharing of ideas they would not have been as valuable, so thank you for attending and providing feedback to help us continue to improve. We have already started planning next year's R.O.C. to make it the best it can be.

The second item here is the start of your riding season. As you and your members get out and start riding, make sure to stop in at your sponsoring dealer for an initial **Ride 365 Annual Mileage Reading** and encourage your chapter members to do the same. Best practice – get a reading early in the riding season, several throughout the riding season and the last as late into the riding season as possible. This will provide participating members with the best opportunity to maximize the miles for the Annual/Chapter Mileage Contests and rewards as they reach each milestone. *Key Reminder*: a point many RIDERS miss, while all mileage readings add to Lifetime mileage, a member's first reading in a calendar year is a 'contest entry' only. The member is 'entered' into the Annual/Chapter Challenges at '0' miles. Subsequent mileage readings must be taken to contribute to your annual mileage for the calendar year.

Lastly, as a reminder, if you need help, remember to consult the Chapter Charter, Chapter Handbook as well as your fellow officers and sponsoring dealer, all have a wealth of knowledge about H.O.G. operations.

I look forward to seeing you out on the road and working with you to make your chapter the best it can be. Your efforts and time involved in managing the chapter are very much appreciated.

Be Spontaneous and Inclusive

This year's Regional Officer Connection virtual training sessions are in the books, and hopefully you had a chance to attend one of the sessions. ROC training always generates great dialogue between your H.O.G. Regional Managers and fellow Chapter officers from around the country about best practices and ideas to help grow and engage your local chapter membership. A couple of themes really stood out during this year's working sessions. First is the importance of embracing inclusivity in your Chapter activities. What does this mean? It's thinking about ways to create events, rides, and other activities with a goal of attracting as many different types of riders as possible, not just your "regulars." Think about creating events geared riders of all skill and experience levels, from newbies to veterans, as well as scheduling events at various times and days of the week that can fit into a wide variety of busy schedules. One way to do this is by creating self-guided rides that members can complete on their own schedule. There is no one size that fits all; being inclusive really means being flexible and trying to meet as many members on their own terms as possible.

Another topic was the success that many chapters are having by using spontaneous "rewards" to encourage members to get out and ride. These can be small things like gift cards, gas cards, poker chips, challenge coins, etc. that you can use as a surprise and delight to thank someone for completing a challenging, attending an event or to recognize their achievement of a riding milestone, like a mileage goal or a first overnight trip or solo ride. Work with your dealer or chapter manager to come up with ways to implement this idea in your chapter.



Is your Ride Book ready?

Whether you call it a calendar of events, a schedule of activities, or your Chapter Ride Book, planning, publishing, and promoting the rides and other events you have planned for the upcoming year is critical. With Spring riding weather in full force almost everywhere, now is the time to wrap up your plans for the remainder of the year and start communicating and promoting all the great events your Chapter offers with your members. Once your Ride Book is complete, use email, social media and the h-d.com/events planning tool to share your rides.



Mentor New Riders

New riders, especially those who are graduates of Harley-Davidson Riding Academy, present a great opportunity to grow your chapter membership. Think about ways you and your fellow Chapter members can engage with and mentor new riders along their journey on their own terms, especially if your sponsoring dealership also offers Riding Academy training.

For chapters with a Riding Academy program, you can reach out to other local rider training programs (in many parts of the country rider training is offered at local community colleges) and invite new riders to join your chapter for a meet and great or a ride. 


Outside the Box Riding Events


If we've learned one thing during the COVID-19 pandemic, it's that all the old rules are out. What "always worked" in the past might not anymore, and many people are not interested in reverting back to old practices even as things start to return to normal. One way you can embrace this reality is to think of new types of rides and chapter activities that make it easy for people to participate on their own time and terms. Many chapters are having great success with planning new types of rides that allow their members to ride on their own time and their own terms but still feel like they are participating together with a group or community of riders. Some examples of rides that chapters have created include Observation Rides, where each rider independently runs the same route or visits pre-determined locations and is then quizzed about things they saw or learned. You can create a leaderboard or award prizes based on who scores best on the post-ride quiz. Another similar idea is to create a scavenger hunt that members can complete on their own schedule. These are just two ways you can begin to think "outside the box" when it comes to creating fun new ways for your members to get out and ride.


